1. **B) my brother's car** — One owner takes 's before the s: brother's.
2. **A) my grandparents' house** — A regular plural already ends in -s, so it takes only an apostrophe after it.
3. **C) children's** — Children is an irregular plural with no -s of its own, so it takes a full 's.
4. **A) the leg of the table** — For things rather than living owners, English normally prefers the of-structure.
5. **B) its** — Its is the possessive and takes no apostrophe. It's always means it is or it has.
6. **C) Tom and Ana's** — When two people own one thing together, only the second name takes 's.
7. **C) week's** — Time expressions take the possessive: a week's holiday, two months' notice.
8. **A) men's** — Men is an irregular plural, so it takes a full 's.
9. **B) It's a beautiful day.** — Here it's is short for it is, so the apostrophe is required.
10. **D) students'** — Several students is a regular plural, so the apostrophe follows the -s.
