1. **D) works** — A third-person singular subject adds -s to the verb in the present simple.
2. **C) go** — They is plural, so the verb takes no -s.
3. **C) watches** — A verb ending in -ch takes -es in the third person so the ending can be pronounced.
4. **C) studies** — A consonant plus -y becomes -ies: study, studies.
5. **C) starts** — The film is a singular third-person subject, so the verb takes -s.
6. **D) She doesn't like coffee.** — Doesn't already carries the -s, so the main verb goes back to its base form.
7. **A) Does** — Your brother is third person singular, so the auxiliary is does.
8. **D) have** — We is plural, so have takes no ending.
9. **B) does** — Do is irregular in the third person: he does.
10. **D) boils** — The present simple states general truths and scientific facts.
