2. **B) There were** — Three cinemas is plural, so the verb is were.
3. **D) There was** — Traffic is uncountable and therefore singular, so the verb is was.
4. **D) There were** — People is a countable plural, so the verb is were — even after a lot of.
5. **B) There wasn't** — Milk is uncountable and singular, so the negative is there wasn't.
6. **A) There weren't** — Shops is a countable plural, so the negative is there weren't.
7. **D) Was there** — A message is singular, and the verb moves in front of there to make a question.
8. **A) Were there** — Tickets is plural, so the question begins with were there.
9. **C) There was a problem with the booking.** — A problem is one singular thing, so the verb is was.
