A. Multiple choice

1. **C) I like this book very much.** — Nothing may sit between a verb and its object, so very much has to move to the end of the clause.
2. **A) usually swims** — A frequency adverb goes before the main verb: she usually swims.
3. **B) I bought a new jacket.** — English adjectives go in front of the noun they describe, unlike Spanish, French or Italian.
4. **C) at the airport at ten** — Place normally comes before time at the end of an English sentence.
5. **A) I lost** — The subject comes first and takes the subject form: I lost.
6. **B) always goes** — Always goes before the main verb, not after it.
7. **C) is never late** — With be, the frequency adverb comes after the verb: she is never late.
8. **C) She gave me the tickets.** — With two objects and no to, the person comes before the thing: gave me the tickets.
9. **B) often eat** — Frequency adverbs sit between the subject and the main verb.
10. **A) a big old wooden table** — English stacks adjectives in a fixed sequence: size, then age, then material.

1. **Where** — A question word fills the first slot, before the auxiliary and the subject. The answer names a place, so the word is where.
2. **When** — The reply gives a time, so the first slot takes when. What time is equally natural here.
3. **Why** — The reply gives a reason, so the question opens with why.
4. **How** — The reply gives a method, which is what how asks for.
5. **Who** — The reply identifies a person, so the question word is who.
6. **Do** — In a present simple question the auxiliary comes before the subject. With you it is do.
7. **Is** — Be makes its own question by moving in front of the subject — no auxiliary is added.
8. **Does** — A singular third-person subject takes does at the front, and the main verb stays bare.
