1. **D) warmer** — Warm is a one-syllable adjective, so it takes -er.
2. **A) more difficult** — Difficult has three syllables, so it takes more.
3. **B) better** — Good is irregular and becomes better.
4. **C) worse** — Bad is irregular and becomes worse.
5. **A) further** — Far is irregular and becomes further or farther.
6. **C) easier** — Two-syllable adjectives ending in -y change the y to i and add -er.
7. **B) bigger** — A short vowel plus a single consonant doubles the consonant: big -> bigger.
8. **D) She is taller than me.** — The comparison word is than, and tall takes -er.
9. **D) as** — As ... as expresses equality between two things.
10. **B) as big** — The negative of the equality structure keeps the plain adjective between as and as.
