4. **D) went** — A named year closes the period, so the past simple is used.
5. **D) Have** — Ever asks about experience at any time, which needs the present perfect.
6. **C) did** — A when question asks about a specific finished moment.
7. **C) have lived** — Since introduces a period continuing to now.
8. **C) lived** — The situation is over, so the past simple is correct.
