2. **A) will sort** — A decision taken at the moment of speaking, in response to what was just said, takes will.
3. **C) am meeting** — A fixed arrangement already agreed with other people takes the present continuous.
4. **C) ends** — A timetabled event outside anyone's control takes the present simple.
5. **B) will have migrated** — By plus a future point with a completed action is the future perfect.
6. **D) will be lying** — An action in progress at a stated future moment takes the future continuous.
7. **C) will have been working** — Duration measured up to a future point takes the future perfect continuous.
